1. Introductions and approval of last months meeting minutes.
2. Rob gave an update on **the awarded SPF-SIG Grant** for Burnett County – maximum funding of \$87,700 for this first round.
 - ✓ 20 grants funded throughout the state. Burnett County will be collaborating with the 5 other sites funded with the same focus area – reducing traffic injuries and fatalities due to underage drinking.
 - ✓ Hired a full time SPF/SIG Coordinator – Lill Pinero, who will be starting the position on May 1st. Welcome Lill!
 - ✓ Also hired Lisa Johnson and Randy Horsman to help with the Community Assessment phase of the grant. (20 hours per week)
 - ✓ Need to send a team of 3-5 people to (3) state trainings all held in WI Rapids. **Please let Rob know if you are interested in attending. The state prefers the team composition stay the same for all trainings.**
 - May 19 and 20, June 18, and July 21 and 22
 - ✓ Also, would like to send a team, (through grant funding) to the State Prevention Conference in Stevens Point on June 9, 10 and 11. Jackie Brenizer, Lisa Johnson, Bridget Getts, Jill Norman or other school rep may be interested and will follow-up with Rob. If others are interested in attending contact Rob.
 - ✓ Rob gave an overview of the budget for the first 5 months of the grant. Required to put aside \$25,000 for evaluation/training purposes. UW Population Studies will be doing the state evaluation for all grantees. \$15,000 will go toward a comprehensive community assessment. Other funding areas include; \$4,000 - youth retreat listening sessions, \$3,000 – Town Hall Meetings, \$4,000 – supplies and general operating budget
 - ✓ “A lot of work needs to be done in the next 5 months!” **Everyone needs to be thinking about where they may have an interest in supporting the grant.**
3. Parents Who host Lose the Most Campaign
 - ✓ Meeting will be held on Friday May 1st. 9:00 am at the Govt. Center. Tavern League representative invited to join as well.
 - ✓ There will be a statewide media blitz on the Campaign so watch for PSA's and local newspaper promotion.
 - ✓ Compliance Checks will be facilitated by law enforcement and others at least once before the end of May. (97 liquor licenses in the county) Compliance Checks

will focus on Grantsburg Township, the Village of Webster and Meenon Township – approximately 25-30 establishments will be visited.

- ✓ Need students to help with Compliance Checks – Bridget will contact WITC to see if there might be students in the criminal justice program who would volunteer.
- ✓ Starting small with the Campaign this year and grow for next year.
- ✓ Other discussion included movie trailer, add to school websites.
