1. Introductions
2. Minutes were approved from the last two meetings.
3. Diane Lindh from Public Health presented on the results of tobacco compliance checks. There were 37 checks and 5 sales which is 13.5% and the highest since 2002. Clerks looked at ID's and still sold. Cigarette licenses are \$5.00. Discussion on the electronic cigarettes, and spit less Camel Snus, Remington's - 15 different flavors under \$12/pack - same as tobacco. By October 2009 all cigarettes in WI will be extinguishable. 55% cut in tobacco money, now when you call the quit line you only receive 2 weeks of gum/or patches.
4. Community readiness interviews are almost done, we are waiting on three. Based on priority leadership, knowledge, and climates in the community. Interviewed key people such as law enforcement, school board, and religious people. We are scoring average of 3 which is vague awareness. We don't want to start rolling out environmental strategies if community isn't ready for it. AJ, Lil, Rob, and Lisa went to training to view this interview information. A lot of people don't know what resources are in the community.
5. Environmental scans - two page worksheet, just follow the questions - need to go to grocery stores, bars, gas stations in Siren, Webster, and Grantsburg areas. AJ reports Grantsburg area is done. Deb, Tessa, and Lil will work on the other communities.
6. Community Perception Surveys: 41 were collected at the Dairy Breakfast, 56 at the Webster fair. Renee' collected some from CRA. Tessa from BCHHS, jail, DOC, ICAA. Also at Access. Lisa gave an overview of results

so far: 116 completed 1/3 male and 2/3 female. Supports or follows up with YBRS.

7. Lisa brought in the tri-fold and the medicine cabinet that have been displayed at events. Many thanks to Lisa and Lil on the great job they did on them. Also they have heard great feedback from the display.
8. BCAAPC brochure was designed by Lisa and Lil. Great job!
9. Focus group: 1 done so far for age group of 21-34. It was held at From The Grind Up. Went well, got some good suggestions.
10. No health classes in Senior High due to budget cuts, only one in Junior High. It was suggested that all kids need to read *7 Steps Of Highly Effective Teenagers* before they graduate.
11. Website will be up and running in the next month or so. It will have information such as what is going on, minutes, community activities and such. Any links that people think would be appropriate can be on.
12. Logo contest - when school is back in maybe have a logo design contest.
13. Doug from St. Croix Tribe gave an update: They are on the second round of community surveys; no preliminary data yet is available perhaps by next meeting it will be available. A lot of activities including culture camp, male and female camping trips, all culture retreat and softball game, trails program, prevention sharing conference.
